#### Response:

My artistic process recaptured my journey with running. In making each piece, I asked myself, "How can I develop the story of my success with running, descent into injury, and eventual return through art?"

A great concern I had when starting was actually developing a runner — a dynamic figure — as a subject matter. To prepare, I practiced with representing figures of runners (slide 1), as well as with capturing emotion with facial features (slide 8). These sketchbook developments provided me with an understanding of how each detail can greatly affect the subject's mood. Between each piece, I wanted to try something new and build upon a skill I had already been developing. Perspective as a whole was a factor I sought to consistently experiment with between works. Subject perspective was constantly played with, as slide 5, 12, and 15 are vastly different in view towards the figure, allowing me to focus on different emotions. I experimented with the perspective of pieces as whole, such as with the atmospheric perspective in slide 2. I highlighted major revisions with slides 5 and 6. With this work, I spent multiple attempts capturing the heroism that running brings out from me.









#### Scoring Criteria

Row B: Practice, Experimentation, and Revision – Score: 3

Visual evidence of practice, experimentation, AND revision demonstrates development of the sustained investigation. AND

Written evidence **describes how** the sustained investigation shows evidence of practice, experimentation, **OR** revision.

#### Score Rationale

The visual evidence demonstrates the development of an inquiry that addresses "success with running, descent into injury, and eventual return through art." There is evidence of practice through a broad exploration of materials by using a variety of media. The work exhibits experimentation using acrylic paint, pencil, colored pencil, marker, and digital media to portray an understanding of a runner's experience in a powerful manner (images 2, 5, 7, and 12). The written statement and visual evidence indicate intentional revision to create unity in the works through purposeful change and evolution, "between each piece, I wanted to try something new and build upon a skill I had already been developing." For example, purposeful decision-making of color palette and glazing techniques create atmospheric perspective (image 2) and color harmony (images 6 and 7). Process images 1, 6, 10, and 13 present evidence of alteration and polishing of ideas using a sketchbook.
