Score Rationale

The written evidence identifies materials, processes, and ideas throughout the portfolio.

The body of work provides visual evidence through readily available items and demonstrates good 3-D skills. Throughout the portfolio, proficient use of natural components and some manufactured items are constructed to create meaningful compositions that effectively use figure-ground relationships, texture, and occupied/unoccupied space. The technical aspects of attaching and combining different components are visible, but in some works, the refinement of forms does not reach an advanced level. Overall, the works demonstrate proficiency and earned a score of 4.

The visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are evident through the assemblage construction method. However, in most instances, written information needs to foster more clarity, development, and association. For instance, the conceptual connection is uncertain regarding the reference in Work 1 to "leaves representing an individual's ingrained nature." In Work 2, the attempt to link "purpose in pain" with the rewards of aging, as depicted through the symbolism of the rocking chair, is unresolved in relation to the visual relationship. Overall, the materials and processes are listed as descriptions that do not synthesize effectively with the idea.
