#### **Question 2: Translation: Caesar**

### 15 points

For every correctly translated segment, award one point. The response must correctly translate all words in a given segment to receive credit for that segment.

1 *Eadem*: same [must modify *nocte*]

1 point each

nocte: (on/in/during) the night

accidit: it happens/occurs, it happened/occurred

ut: that, with the result that

2 esset: (there/it) was/is

*luna*: moon [must be subject of *esset*]

plena: full [must modify luna]

**3** *qui*: which [must be nominative or modify *dies*]

dies: day [must be nominative]

efficere: to produce/make/create, bring about, cause, carry out, effect

consuevit: was/is accustomed, established

4 *maritimos aestus*: tides [must be object of *efficere*]

*maximos*: greatest, highest, largest; very great, very high, very large [must modify *aestus*]

5 in: in/on/of/for

Oceano: ocean, water(s), sea; English Channel

6 *nostris*: to/by our men, soldiers, people, sailors

-que: and

id: it, this/that, fact, event, situation, thing, matter

erat: was

incognitum: unknown/not known

7 Ita: thus, for this/that reason, (and) so, in this way, therefore

**uno:** one, the same, this/that [must modify tempore]

tempore: (at/in) time

**8** (*et*): and, both

longas: long

**naves:** ships, boats [whole segment is scored for definition only]

[longas naves can be rendered as "warships"]

**9 quas:** which [must be object of subduxerat]

**Caesar:** Caesar [must be subject of *subduxerat*]

**10** *in*: on(to)/in/into

aridum: dry (land), shore/beach, sand

subduxerat: had pulled up, lifted up, raised, led, hauled up, beached

**11** *aestus*: tide(s), sea(s), wave(s) [must be the subject of *compleverat*]

compleverat: had filled up, covered, overwhelmed

**12** et: and

*onerarias*: transport ships [must be the direct object of *adflictabat*]
