
#### Response:

My SI question is "How can I use visual language to explore the emotional and psychological boundaries between myself and the world around me?" As I move through public and private spaces, like, subways, restaurants, and my home, I often feel a disconnect between what is seen on the outside and what is felt internally. I used my SI to explore the tension between collective experience and personal emotion. Through surreal color, distortion,(12), and layered compositions(14), I represent my inner responses to the external world.

#### Response:

My SI developed through experimentation with color, composition, and material exploring my sense of self within the world around me. 1,2 were more personal, focusing on my family. As I moved into works about friendship and strangers, I used visual chaos and tighter compositions to reflect alienation and overstimulation. In 6, 9, I experimented with materials like foil and yarn to break the flat surface expressing inner conflict. In 4,10, I changed the composition to create a stronger emotional collage. My sketchbook pages document how changes in concept and experimentation guided my revisions.

### **Score Rationale**

This portfolio earns a score of 3 because visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are consistently evident and demonstrate synthesis. The inquiry explores "the tension between collective experience and personal emotion," and this concept is developed through thoughtful material choices and image construction. In Image 4, the use of pencil, charcoal, and tracing paper allows for layering and transparency, visually reinforcing the idea of "hidden tension among friends." In Image 7, the written evidence includes a metaphor, "each bead seems separate, but there's a connection tying them together," which is later realized in Image 6 through the use of yarn, wooden beads, pastel, and acrylic. These materials and processes integrate to portray individuals linked by unseen emotional conflict.

Synthesis is further demonstrated in Image 10, where five versions of the same figure are cut, rearranged, and collaged using paper weaving to express how external forces shape identity. This technique, inspired by Cubism, enhances the psychological impact of the work by merging fragmented views of the same subject. The consistent alignment between conceptual intent, visual execution, and material handling across the portfolio supports a high level of synthesis.

**Summary:** This portfolio earns a score of 3 because visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are integrated throughout the sustained investigation. The artist consistently makes intentional choices that connect meaning, materials, and design, demonstrating synthesis across the body of work.
