





Score Rationale

This portfolio earned a score of 1 because the written evidence does not identify an inquiry. The response presents a personal narrative and references a general theme of "childhood ideas and dreams," but it does not describe a process of discovery or questioning that guided the body of work. Statements such as "I've always had an obsession with horror and very creepy figures" and "I found my spark through my childhood ideas" describe inspiration but not a focused investigation.

The visual evidence supports the stated interest in horror but also lacks evidence of an evolving or guided investigation. For example, in Images 2 and 6, grotesque polymer clay figures align with the artist's described obsession, but there is no indication of how these forms explore deeper ideas or questions. The portfolio instead reads as a collection of themed pieces rather than a sustained exploration.

Summary: The written evidence does not identify an inquiry, and the visual evidence does not demonstrate an investigation guided by questioning or discovery. Together, they support a score of 1 in Row A
