





Score Rationale

This portfolio earned a score of 3 in Row C because visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are evident and demonstrate synthesis. The investigation explores the significance of nostalgia in Black communities through sculptural forms that connect personal memory, cultural identity, and material choice.

In Image 5, the trio of portrait busts uses denim to reference the past while conveying individuality through texture and structure. The written evidence supports this decision, noting the material's connection to "the older generation who created and lived it." The integration of denim as both surface and conceptual element demonstrates clear synthesis. Similarly, in Images 14 and 15, the dual portrait sculpture shows purposeful use of glaze to highlight "stages of growing up," reinforcing the idea of shared yet individual identity. Sketchbook notes linked to Image 13 further clarify the intention to represent iconic childhood experiences, such as the presence of twins in Black communities, and that idea carries visually into the completed forms.

The artist's choices, whether layering spray paint, manipulating form, or selecting culturally resonant materials, are often informed by personal and cultural references. These decisions create strong visual and conceptual connections that support the guiding inquiry.

Summary: Visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are evident and demonstrate synthesis. Intentional decisions connect form and meaning, supporting a score of 3 in Row C.
