Written evidence identifies materials, processes, and ideas.

Score Rationale

The written evidence identifies materials, processes, and ideas, explaining the artistic decisions behind the chosen subjects in each work. The commentary consistently connects material choices and processes to the intended concepts, providing insight into the development and purpose of the works.

Works 1, 2, and 4 demonstrate proficient drawing skills through confident mark making, careful use of color, and effective rendering of form. In Work 1, reflections, cast shadows, and form shadows on the figure's arm create a strong sense of volume. Work 2 features vibrant color application with hatching and crosshatching techniques to model the face, and textured mark making in the hair adds dimensionality. In Work 4, the folds of the dress are skillfully drawn, using value and color contrast to convey depth and maintain emphasis on the central figure. In contrast, Works 3 and 5 show moderate skill, particularly in the limited value range and lack of contrast that flattens the forms—especially in the figures' hands and facial features. Additionally, many works lack developed figureground relationships; however, Work 1 uses the background effectively to add narrative and emotional context. Overall, the portfolio demonstrates a range of moderate to good drawing skills, supporting a score of 4.

Materials, Processes, and Ideas

Visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are evident.

Visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are present across the works, though they fall short of full synthesis. In Work 2, the idea of "African mothers and daughters finding solace in hair and memory" is stated in the written evidence, but the visual depiction lacks a clear representation of the mother figure or their relationship. Similarly, in Work 3, the concept of showing "distinct personalities/difference both physically and spiritually" is not fully supported visually; the right side of the composition is unclear and does not effectively convey the intended contrast. While the ideas are evident and connected to material and process choices, the execution lacks the integration needed for synthesis.

Summary

This Selected Works portfolio component earned a score of 4 because the written evidence identifies materials, processes, and ideas, and consistently explains artistic choices. The portfolio demonstrates good drawing skills, particularly in Works 1, 2, and 4, through confident mark making, effective use of value, and strong form rendering. While visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are evident, they lack the full integration and conceptual clarity needed for synthesis in some works.
