CONFIRM YOUR TEEN IS REGISTERED FOR AP EXAMS



Did you know that nearly all colleges and universities award credit for qualifying AP® Exam scores for the most popular courses? In fact, most AP students who enroll in four-year colleges start school with some credit. The only way your teen can earn credit or advanced placement is by taking their AP Exam. But even students who achieve a score of 2 on their AP Exams do better in introductory college classes.

Completing an AP course and exam gives your teen the opportunity to:




SAVE MONEY

Don’t Let Your Teen Miss These Opportunities

The deadline for schools to submit their AP Exam order is November 15, but most schools have an earlier deadline for students to make their selections. Confirm your teen is registered for their spring 2023 AP Exams by reaching out to their teacher or the school’s AP coordinator well before the school’s registration deadline and follow these steps:
