Describe how your sustained investigation shows evidence of practice, experimentation, and revision guided by your question(s) or inquiry.

Response:

My sustained investigation was constructed based around my passion for sneakers and how it can be seen as an obsession or addiction. Throughout the pieces in my concentration, you can see how my inspirations are from different aspects and trends of sneaker culture.

In my sketches, I explore using different mediums such as Prisma pencils and digital media. The first piece depicts a behavioral habit of a person who loves sneakers, this behavior is somewhat similar to an addict. Pieces 7 & 8 were made in sequence to show two related events. The subject is sitting in the bathroom cleaning his favorite shoes. In piece 8 the subject is surrounded by multiple pairs of sneakers to emphasize his obsessive love for them and that they are “prized possessions” to him. All pieces are done digitally pulling inspiration and references from the sneaker culture on social media. Like piece in 11 depicts the subject holding his sneakers to his head taking part of the trend of flaunting items on social media. But in this piece there is a hidden message about addiction in the hanging tag. Though the pieces are connected to visually communicate satiric humor, they also embrace my passion for sneakers.

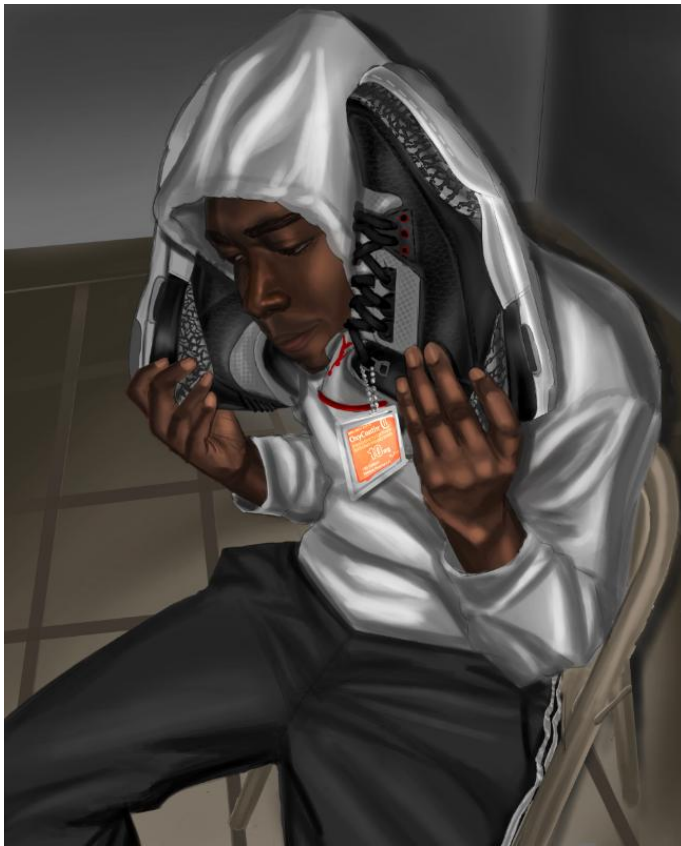

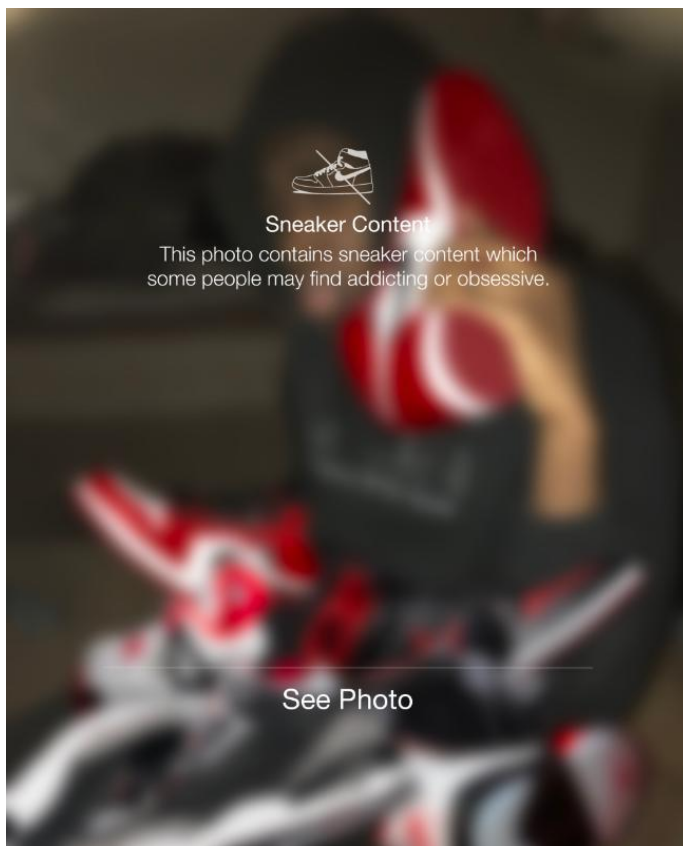

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2-D Art and Design Sustained Investigation, *Score 3/3/3/3*

Scoring Criteria

Rationale for Score

Row A: Inquiry – Score: 3

Written evidence **identifies** an inquiry that **guides** the sustained investigation.
AND

Visual evidence **demonstrates** the sustained investigation.

Written evidence identifies an inquiry “My sustained investigation was constructed based around my passion for sneakers and how it can be seen as an obsession or addiction.” The student artist articulates that the sustained investigation is guided by sneaker culture. “Throughout the pieces...you can see how my inspirations are from different aspects and trends of sneaker culture.” The student elaborates, “In my sketches, I explore using different mediums such as Prisma pencils and digital media...The first piece depicts a behavioral habit of a person who loves sneakers, this behavior is somewhat similar to an addict.” Images 7 and 8 “were made in sequence to show two related events.” The written statements give insight into the inquiry and how it guided the sustained investigation.

Additional guiding information accompanies all of the images. The text added to image 12 states, “Pieces done simultaneously and combined to capture one’s reaction of their shoe being stepped on,” and connects a narrative to the image that furthers the inquiry. Image 15 includes a self-referential and humorous take on sneaker culture.

The visual evidence presents well-developed process images (3 and 6) and dynamic and well-considered compositions overall and demonstrates the sustained investigation.

Row B: Practice, Experimentation, and Revision – Score: 3

Visual evidence of practice, experimentation, **AND** revision **demonstrates development** of the sustained investigation.

AND

Written evidence **describes how** the sustained investigation shows evidence of practice, experimentation, **OR** revision.

This portfolio shows visual and written evidence of practice, experimentation, AND revision. The processes used in making the images link to the overall focus of the sustained investigation, and both written and visual evidence show a purposeful engagement with materials, processes, and ideas. The written evidence states, “In my sketches, I explore using different mediums such as Prisma pencils and digital media” (images 1 and 2). “All pieces are done digitally pulling inspiration and references from the sneaker culture on social media” (images 9 and 12). Image 11 “depicts the subject holding his sneakers to his head, taking part in the trend of flaunting items on social media. But in this piece, there is a hidden message about addiction in the hanging tag.” The written statements describe how the sustained investigation shows evidence of practice, experimentation, OR revision.

Practice, experimentation, and revision continue throughout the portfolio, and the complex and higher-level images display revision. The process images (2 and 6) offer a comprehensive look into the practice and revision contained in the finished works (images 4, 7, and 8). Further demonstrations of experimentation occur in the varied views selected for the images (4, 8, and 14). Cropping, framing, diagonal lines of composition, and the emphasis of the color red as a connecting element of the designs demonstrate the development of the sustained investigation through practice, experimentation, and revision.

**Row C: Materials, Processes,
and Ideas – Score: 3**

Visual relationships

AND ideas are **clearly evident**
and **demonstrate synthesis**.

Visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are clearly evident and demonstrate synthesis in this portfolio. The written evidence states, "My sustained investigation was constructed based around my passion for sneakers and how it can be seen as an obsession or addiction" and "throughout the pieces in my concentration, you can see how my inspirations are from different aspects and trends of sneaker culture." The artist's intention is present in this portfolio and demonstrates an in-depth exploration of the subject using materials, processes, and ideas.

The sustained investigation shows many clear and thoughtful design decisions. The work demonstrates development AND synthesis through the following examples: thoughtful and well-explored process images (images 3 and 6); a visual narrative that uses point of view, worms-eye and birds-eye (images 7 and 10) for dynamic impact; "The overall tones in the piece were toned down so that the shoes would become the focus to the eye" (image 3); "Pieces done simultaneously and combined to capture one's reaction of their shoe being stepped on" (images 12 and 13). These statements give insight into compositional choices.

Synthesis is evident in this portfolio through a high level of achievement among materials, processes, and ideas.

**Row D: 2-D/3-D/Drawing
Art and Design Skills – Score: 3**

Visual evidence of **good and advanced**
2-D/3-D/Drawing skills.

The visual evidence in this portfolio demonstrates good and advanced 2-D skills. In all images, the visual evidence shows a strong understanding of asymmetrical and symmetrical compositions (image 2, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 10), color and light emphasis (images 2, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 12), form repetitions (images 5, 7, and 8), figure/ground relationships (images 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, and 15) and movement (image 5). The visual evidence shows advanced skill in hierarchy, lighting, and composition in telling a story (images 5, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14, and 15).

The visual evidence in this portfolio demonstrates advanced 2-D skills.

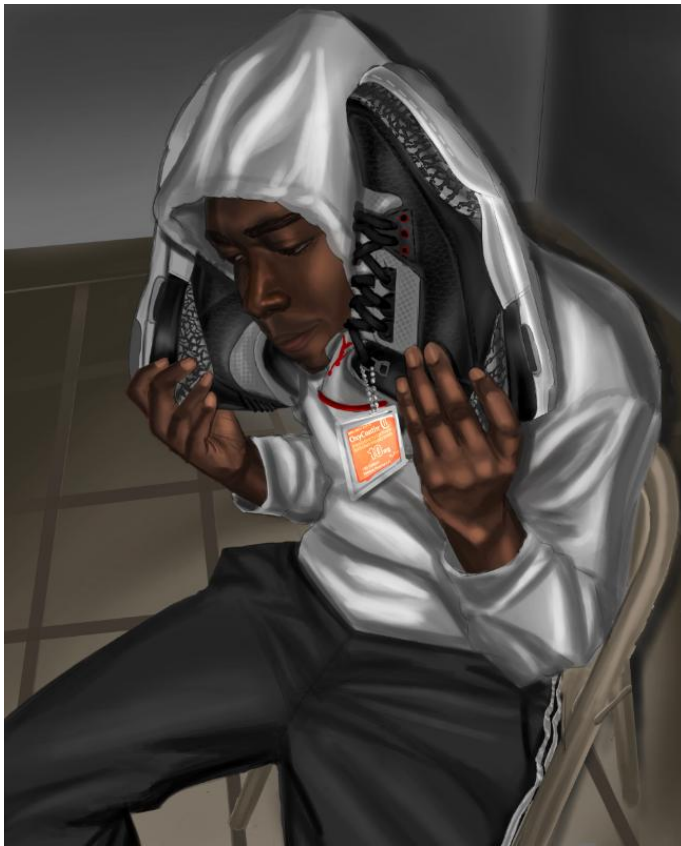

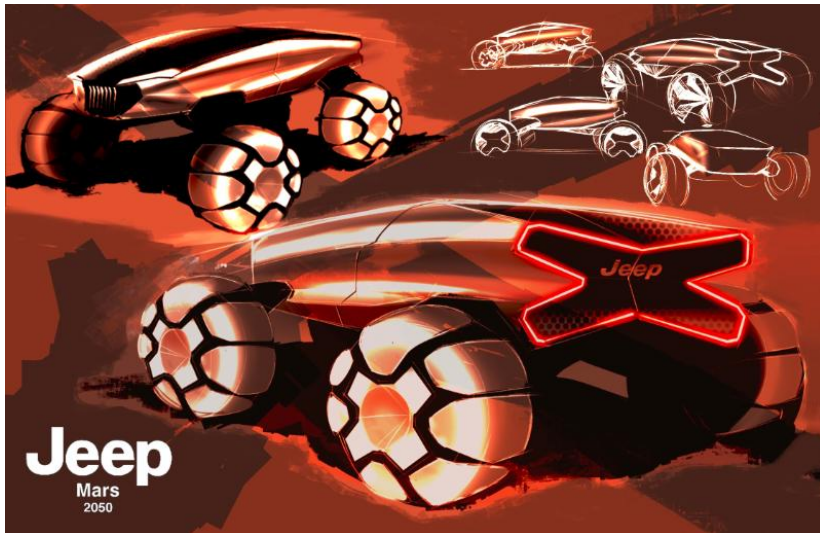

Scoring Criteria

Rationale for Score

2-D/3-D/Drawing Art and Design Skills

Visual evidence of **advanced** 2-D/3-D/Drawing **skills**.

The visual evidence demonstrates advanced 2-D skills. In all, the visual evidence shows an advanced understanding of asymmetrical compositions (images 1-5), color emphasis (images 1 and 2), form repetitions (images 1-5), figure/ground relationships (images 1-3), movement (image 4), and color/shape/space unity (image 4 and 5). The visual evidence shows advanced skill in hierarchy and graphic design (images 4 and 5).

Materials, Processes, and Ideas

Visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are **clearly evident** and **demonstrate synthesis**.

Visual relationships among materials, processes, and ideas are clearly evident and demonstrate synthesis. Quotes from the processes and ideas text communicate this evidence. "Pulled inspiration of crashing waves and implemented that into the design of the sole and upper" (image 5). The wave creates dynamic movement, which is echoed in the heel of the running shoe design (lower right) and again in the blurred shoe (upper left). For the Jeep-inspired Mars rover, "I deliberately added this rusty orange filter to place the concept vehicle in an environment of Mars" (image 1).

The visual and written evidence show clear evidence of synthesis among ideas and the process of making the image, "Painted the subject's environment and hard shadows to capture a likeness of a camera flash" (image 1). Synthesis is further demonstrated in leading one's focus to the subject presented. "The overall tones in the piece were toned down so that the shoes would become the focus to the eye" (image 3). The work shows a high degree of confidence in technical skill and wit in ideas.
